## FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK:

It has been another busy season at ERCS! We have had CAASO badminton and basketball tournaments, skating days, a ski trip to Hockley Valley, a 100-day celebration, and sung at a Guelph Storm game. Our students have completed science projects, improved their math and reading skills, and continued to grow and develop in their social-emotional learning.
During our Friday assembly times, we focused on 1 Corinthians 13 and learning how to love each other better. Specifically, we have learned that:

- If we do the right thing but for the wrong reason, it's not love (Verses 1-3).
- Love is putting someone else's needs ahead of your own (Love is patient).
- Saying something true in an unkind way isn't love (Love is kind).
- Thankfulness is the antidote to envy (Love does not
 envy).
- Loving others means taking an interest in them, not just talking about yourself (Love does not boast).
As I prepared these lessons for our students, it struck me how simple these ideas seem on the surface and how hard they can be to put into daily practice. The Pharisees asked Jesus, what is the greatest commandment? He responded by saying, "Love God and love others."

When we love others and put their needs ahead of our own, we love them the way God would. There is no more extraordinary gift that we can bring to the world. As adults, we must demonstrate to our kids what Godly love looks like.

- How do you respond when something doesn't go your way?
- Do you put the needs of others ahead of your own?
- Do you consistently use kind words?
- Is thankfulness part of your daily practice?
- Do you demonstrate an interest in others?

As busy adults, it can be easy to gloss over these words from the Bible. However, our children watch us to see how we respond to disappointment. They are listening to the words that come out of our mouths. They are taking note of how we deal with challenging people. My encouragement to you is to choose love each day. Living as Jesus lived is the best example that we can set for our children.
